

RRIN holds November edition of her Monthly Seminar Series (MSS)

The October Edition of the RRIN MSS took place on Tuesday, 31<sup>st</sup> of October, 2023. As it is with other Seminars, there were two presenters. The first presentation by Dr. (Mrs) O.A. Emuedo, which was coauthored by several other Research Scientists was on "Basal Studies of Mortex as a latex yield stimulant of Hevea brasiliensis". In her presentation, she outlined the reason for the use of stimulants in rubber exploitation, comparing the efficacy of three different types of stimulants (Mortex 25 &50, Ethephon and Vitex) on latex yield of the experimental trees. The study showed that the Mortex 50, stimulated trees produced the highest final volume of latex, but noted that the Control trees had the highest DRC. She concluded that more work needs to be done to ascertain the long-term effect of the stimulant on latex production

The second presentation by Dr. E.O.O. Obaze, dwelled on "Preparation and characterization of biodiesel from crude and refined rubber seed oil via homogenous catalysts". The study which was also coauthored by several other Scientists, discussed different samples of biodiesel ((methyl ester)) preparation from crude and refined rubber seed oil (RSO), using different homogeneous catalysts (sodium hydroxide (I), sulfuric acid (II), hydrochloric acid (III) and phosphoric acid (IV)). The study showed that sodium hydroxide gave the highest and lowest yields (95% and 13%) overall from refined and crude RSO respectively, while sulfuric acid gave the highest yield from crude RSO.

The study concluded that all the obtained RSO methyl esters exhibited fuel properties within the recommended range according to ASTM standard.

There was a question and answer session after the presentation.

The Director/CEO RRIN in the company of some of the Directors in the Institute; Dr. K.O Omokhafe, Dr. T.U Esekhade, Dr O. Egharevba and her Technical Assistant Dr. C. Okwu paid a courtesy visit to Benin-Owena River Basin Development Authority on the 16<sup>th</sup> of November, 2023. The meeting commenced by 2pm with the MD, Engr. Saliu Ahmed and 4 of his Directors, his Technical Assistant and Public Relation Officer in attendance.

After the exchange of pleasantries, The ED, RRIN in her opening remarks said one thing both institutes have in common is FOOD SECURITY and one of her focus is to empower youths through food security, she dwelled on the Rubber Agroforestry (RAF) model that have been developed by her institute which has impacted the lives of both young and old smallholders rubber farmers through capacity building and establishment of this model in several communities.

The agenda of the visit was to:

 Establish a formal relationship with the only federal agency within the same LGA sharing the same Dukedom



- Seeking possible partnership in area of food security and Staff welfare
- Invitation to RRIN 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary
- Financial assistance for the Medical outreach as a way of giving back to our host communities after 50 years in existence.

The MD, Benin-Owena RBDA expressed his gratitude for the initiative of the ED, RRIN to reach out to his institute as he has been on seat in the last seven (7) years without reaching out to a fellow federal agency within his domain, sharing same 'ancestry' and co-existing in the same dukedom. He also congratulated RRIN on their forthcoming 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and pledged to support the initiative of giving back to the host community through the proposed medical outreach. The MD, went further to say that their main expertise is water abstraction and irrigation and they cover four States namely; Edo, Ondo, Ekiti and the northern district of Delta State with area offices in all States. Their focus is to have an organic network of producers, they pioneer integrated farms and are in partnership with Sunrise in training and related farming activities.

The MD also promised to kick start the initiative to promote community relationship, he informed his visitors that in the past, their institute in partnership with an international body had trained and equipped well over 60 youths on beekeeping with the aim that the youths will pay back through sales of honey and byproducts. The MD however regretted that the outcome was not impactful. Dr. L.N. Dongo responded that RRIN can come in, in the area of selection criteria and capacity building for the participants.

Dr. K.O. Omokhafe gave the vote of thanks and also reiterated that RRIN have developed a mechanism of selecting participants for such projects and this could be one of the ways both institutes can collaborate. He also went further to say, that the DAM situated at Otuo, Edo State can also serve/assist RRIN experimental station at Otuo.

### Meeting of Rubber Stakeholders with The Secretary General, International Rubber Study Group (IRSG), Abuja

The Executive Director/CEO and her Technical assistant attended the Rubber Stakeholders meeting on the 7<sup>th</sup> of December, 2023 by 11 am at the conference room, Raw Materials Research and Development Council, Abuja. The agenda of the meeting was to discuss and deliberate the forthcoming World Rubber Congress/Submit that will be hosted by Nigeria from the 20<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> of May, 2024. This congress is proposed to be promising

in the area of creating opportunity for big players in the Rubber industry to interact with Rubber Stakeholders, create business opportunities, exchange ideas and technology transfers.

In attendance where representatives from the following organizations; Raw Materials Research and Development Council, Ministries of Trade and Investment, Agriculture and Food Security, Rubber Research Institute of Nigeria, NARPPMAN, FRADRO, Royal farms, Essential Strides, Imoniyame Holdings and others.

This meeting was co-chaired by Prof. Joseph Adelegan, the Secretary General, IRSG and the NARPPMAN President, Otunba Prince Peter Igbinosun. The agenda for this meeting was to;

- 1. Deliberate on the Venue for the World Rubber Submit
- 2. Constitute the Local Organizing Community (LOC)
- 3. Key topics/lecture

The Sec. Gen., IRSG stated in his address to the stakeholders that the aim of Nigeria being Host for next World Rubber Submit is to attract investment to Nigeria, this is because one of the ways to drive the rubber sector in Nigeria is through public-private partnership. He proposed that the month of March, 2024 have been slated to raise funding for this Summit.

The floor was open to the stakeholders to discuss the location/venue for the World Rubber Submit. The deliberation was between Abuja where the decision players and the policy makers were located and Benin City, Edo State where the Institute with the mandate to conduct research into the production of natural Rubber is located. The Executive Director/CEO, RRIN gave valid points why the World Rubber Submit should take place in her domain as this course falls within her purview. The points raised were but not limited to availability of large hectarage of Rubber plantations, availability of the Rubber smallholder farmers, their model farms, industries and processors of Rubber and its byproducts. This insight was greatly supported by FRADRO, NARPPMAN president and some other Rubber stakeholders.

In addition, the constitution of the LOC was decided and the following institutes (FRADRO, NARPPMAN, Ministries of Trade and Investment, Agriculture and Food Security, RRIN, BOI, Security, Foreign affairs, RMRDC, immigration, NIPC, DSS, Civil defense and Banks) were selected as members of the LOC for the forth coming program

Furthermore, the deliberation on the Key topic for the World Rubber Summit was the next item on the agenda, the stakeholders concluded that the theme for the submit will guide the topic/lecture to be

The meeting came to an end with the temporary conclusion that the opening ceremony will take place in Abuja while the event will take place in Benin City, Edo State. The final decision on the location for the World Rubber Submit will be disclosed after the Sec, Gen., of IRSG meeting with the Minister.

### Medical Outreach/Surgical Eye Camp

As part of the activities lined up to mark its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Rubber Research Institute of Nigeria in collaboration with the Africa Cataract and Eye Foundation organized a free medical outreach as a way of giving back to its six host Communities (Uhie, Iyanomo, Obagie N'evbuosa, Obaretin, Obayantor and Evbuekpen). Health officers from both the Africa Cataract and Eye Foundation and RRIN were on ground from the 13<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> of November, 2023 to sensitize the members of the host Communities of the medical outreach program.

The medical outreach program commenced from the 25<sup>th</sup> to the 30<sup>th</sup> of November, 2023. The medical team which comprised of health officers from RRIN and the Africa Cataract and Eye Foundation were at the six host Communities, during which, there was about 2500 free eye/medical consultation with medication, 300 free reading glasses; 500 free deworming of children; and over 130 persons penciled down for cataract surgery.

The Surgical eye camp commenced on the 1<sup>st</sup> of December with an opening ceremony which was honorably graced by Dr. Ali, Edo State Commissioner of Health; Prof. Omoti, Officer in Charge of Rural Eye Health in Nigeria; Dr. Okorodudu, the founder, Africa Eye Foundation; Mrs. Okorodudu; Prince Eweka, MD, Airoe Construction Ltd; Enogie of Oghobaghase Dukedom, HRH Akenzua represented by Dr. O. Egharevba; Enogie of Obagie N' Evbuosa, HRH Imadonwiyi, represented by Robert Iserhienhien; Joseph Obasohan, representing the Odionwere of Obaretin; Mathew Omoregbe, representing the Odionwere of Uhie. Also present at the ceremony were the members of the IMC, Programme leaders, Staff and community members penciled down for the cataract surgery.

In her welcome address, Executive Director/CEO of RRIN, Dr. L.N. Dongo said this was a moment of joy and honour for her. She appreciated and welcomed everyone present especially the beneficiaries of the Surgical Eye Camp. She reiterated that the purpose of the surgical eye camp was to "Give back sight to the community people" who RRIN have peacefully co-existed with. "Health is wealth" she said, expressing her gratitude to all donors for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration admonishing all to take good care of their health and families.





Dr. Okorodudu in his address said he had always wanted to work in rural communities because of the stark suffering in such places. He said he chose to work with Dr. L.N. Dongo because of her desire to give back to the community. The programme he said will perform 200 free cataract surgeries, give 300 free reading glasses, 100 prescription glasses for children (donated under the administration led by Dr. L.N. Dongo) and that while the surgery is going on, some members of his team will go to the schools in the community to check the eyes of the children. There is absolutely no need for anybody to be blind from cataract.

The Edo State Health Commissioner, Dr. Alli in his opening address said he was happy to be present for the Eye Camp. He reiterated the importance of the Eye Camp as over 24 million persons in Nigeria have eye issues and about 1.4 million are completely blind. Most of these defects he said are treatable. He also advised that we should watch what we put in our eyes, so as to avoid damage to the eyes and that we should apply/take all medications as directed by the doctor. In his concluding address, he promised to give priority in upgrading the

Prof. Omoti – the Officer in Charge of Rural Eye Health in Nigeria, welcomed all present to the Eye Camp, expressing his pleasure that school children in the host communities will be afforded the opportunity to have their eyes checked and prescription glasses given where necessary. He affirmed that cataract is the leading cause of blindness in the world and that beneficiaries of the surgery can also come from outside the RRIN host communities. He appealed to community leaders to encourage their people to come out for treatment, saying that most of the SDGs require good sight and that people do not die from cataract surgery.

There were also good will messages from the Community leaders present. The Enogie of Oghoghabase said the Executive Director/CEO is changing the narrative of the RRIN in the area of Host Community relationship. The Odionwere of Evbuokpen appreciated all that the Institute had done for them and like the proverbial Oliver Twist, asked for more. He affirmed that both himself and his wife benefitted from the reading glasses.

Thereafter, Dr. Okorodudu demonstrated to all present, the proper way to apply eye drop to the eyes and advised that all members of Staff should make sure they check their eyes before the end of the Eye Camp.




