Inauguration of Gender Unit in RRIN

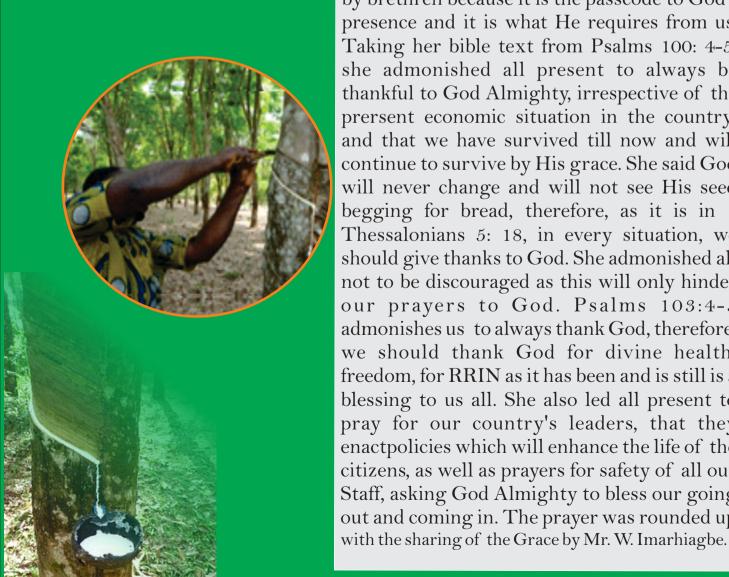

She opined that activities in any Sector either mainstream gender, or are biased against gender, which could be male or female, but in Nigeria, it mostly refers to females, because they are most disadvantaged in this part of the world. The second presentation by Prof. E.U. Edosomwan was on **Wearing a Gender Lens to Upscale Innovation, Research and Productivity,** where she highlighted what 'gender' actually means, what the 'gender lens' is and concluded that women play key roles in any society, being the pillars in agriculture and are also powerful change agents, even though they tend to be bypassed in Science Technology and Innovation (STI) policies and decisions making.

RRIN holds Workshop on Capacity Building for Smallholder Farmers (Youths and Women) on Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) for Production of Rubber Planting Materials and Beekeeping (Honey Production)

One of RRIN's mandate is delivering Extension and Training to Rubber farmers; to achieve this, a Capacity Building for Smallholder Farmers (Youths and Women) on Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) for Production of Rubber Planting Materials and Beekeeping (Honey Production) workshop was organised from the 2nd to 4th December, 2024 at the RRIN Conference Hall.

In her welcome address to the participants, Director/CEO, Dr. L.N. Dongo welcomed all to the Institute and thanked them for taking out time from their farms to participate in the workshop. The workshop she said, underscores our commitment as a research institute to empowering smallholder farmers, especially women and youth, with the knowledge and skills required to enhance their productivity and income, while ensuring sustenable agricultural practices. She opined that Agriculture remains the backbone of our economy and there is the urgent need to prioritize the natural rubber sub-sector, if food sufficiency must be realized; and these smallholder farmers, are the drivers of this sub-sector.

The workshop, serves as a strategic platform to address a majority of the challenges which the smallholder farmers may be facing in the course of their business, such as production of high quality rubber budded stumps, adopt best practices in rubber-intercrop cultivation and explore opportunitites in Bee-keeping. She thereafter thanked all the resource persons for the workshop and encouraged the participants to be attentive to the teachings and demonstrations.

The NARPMAN President, Otunba Peter Igbinosun on his part also welcomed the participants to the workshop, he said that rubber farmers contribute to food security in the country through intercropping and that a reduction in the gestation period of the rubber tree was pertinent to encourage more farmers into the industry.

RRIN conducts Year 2024 Staff Promotion

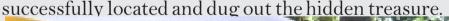

CONGESTIVE HEART FAILURE

Definition

It is a chronic condition where the heart ability to pump blood effectively is impaired, leading to fluid build-up in the body.

Causes:

- 1. Coronary artery disease
- 2. Hypertension
- 3. Myocardial infarction
- 4. Valvular heart disease
- 5. Cardiomyopathy
- 6. Arrhythmia

Symptoms:

- 1. Shortness of breath
- 2. Fatigue and weakness
- 3. Swelling in the legs
- 4. Persistent cough or wheezing
- 5. Rapid or irregular heart beat
- 6. Confusion
- 7. Sudden weight gain

Types:

- 1. Left sided heart failure
- 2. Right sided heart failure
- 3. Bi-ventricular heart failure

Know your PSR SECTION I - GENERAL

020101 - Appointments to public offices in the Federal Civil Service. These appointments are made either:



(a) by letter written under the direction of the Federal Civil Service Commission; or

(b) by formal agreement between the officer and the Federal Government or its appointed agents. Subject to Rules 020205, 020206 and 020207 - Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Extra-Ministerial Offices are authorized to appoint eligible candidates to posts in respect of which the powers of appointment have been delegated to them.

020102 – (i) The Federal Civil Service Commission shall make appointment to posts graded GL.12 – 17. Such appointment shall be made as the need arises into the available vacancies after advertisement. Officers intending to transfer their services shall take part in the annual Public Service Examinations for post GLS 07–10.

(ii) Subject to modalities to be prescribed by the Federal Civil Service Commission from time to time, each Ministry/Extra-Ministerial Office shall select from the pool of successful candidates at the Civil Service Examination prescribed in Rule 020102.

(iii) This shall be handled by the appropriate committees of each Ministry with the representatives of the Federal Civil Service Commission and Head of the Civil Service of the Federation at the meeting of the committees.

(iv) There shall be an annual competitive Civil Service Entry Examination for posts graded GL. 07-10 for new entrants and serving Officers wishing to transfer from other scheduled services. This examination shall be conducted by the Federal Civil Service Commission in conjunction with the Office of the Head of Civil Service of the Federation, Administrative Staff College of Nigeria, and the Public Service Institute of Nigeria.

(v) To qualify for this examination candidates must possess an Honours Degree or Higher National Diploma not below upper credit in relevant disciplines as provided for in the Schemes of Service. Final selection shall be made by the line Ministries/Extra Ministerial Offices in line with their requirements.

020103 (a) Each Ministries/Extra Ministerial Office shall appoint Junior Staff on GL. 06 and below. This shall be handled by the Junior Staff Committee of each Ministry/Office, with a representative of the Federal Civil Service Commission and the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation at any meeting of the committee, subject to the approval of the Permanent Secretary/Head of Extra Ministerial offices,

(b) Appointment in the Federal Ministries/Extra-Ministerial Offices in the States shall be from the residents of that State who possess the qualifications prescribed in the approved Schemes of Service;

(c) Each Ministries/Extra-Ministerial Office shall work out the actual establishment or requirements for each State Office. The Junior Staff Committee (Local) shall conduct the interview to appoint the officers, subject to approval of the Permanent Secretary/Head of Extra Ministerial offices.

020104 - Promotions to all posts in the Federal Public Service other than those of Permanent Secretaries are vested in the

Federal Civil Service Commission which, has however, authorized Permanent Secretaries/ Heads of Extra - Ministerial Offices to promote eligible candidates to posts in respect of which the powers of appointment have been delegated.

020105 - The incremental date of an officer appointed or promoted to

a post in the Federal Public Service shall be I" January of every year provided such officer has spent at least six (6) months on the Grade with good performance before enjoying the increment.

020106 - Seniority in any department shall be determined by the entry date/the assumption of duty certified by an authorized officer as reflected in the appropriate register.

020107 - The employment of unpaid staff is prohibited.

O20108 - (i) Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Extra-Ministerial Offices shall keep an up-to-date record of every officer under their control. Staff Record. Form Gen 60 shall be used and one copy must be sent to the Central Staff Records Office in the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation, Offices of the Accountant General of the Federation and Auditor General for the Federation, National Pension Commission within one month of the appointment. Form Gen 60 shall be completed in ink.

(ii) Date of birth recorded on appointment by an officer shall not

be changed throughout the career of the officer. Any contravention shall be regarded as an act of serious misconduct.

PENSION MATTERS

The National Pension Commission recently issued a revised regulation on retirement and terminal benefits for immediate implementation.

The regulation simplifies some difficulties and guides the process of accessing retirement and terminal benefits by pension contributors and retirees under the Contributory Pension Scheme.

This is the first comprehensive review of the regulation since its initial issuance in 2007.

The commission said the review has input from "key stakeholders" in order to ensure a more efficient retirement benefits administration.

According to a release by the commission recently, the revised regulation contains several new provisions on pension enhancement, voluntary contributions, temporary access to RSA due to loss of job, payment under the Micro Pension Plan, administrative sanctions for violations by Pension Fund Administrators (PFAs), amongst others. The regulation also introduces salient amendments to several existing provisions while providing more clarity on others.

The key highlights of the revised regulation include the simplification of the documentation process, non-confirmation

of employment status by employers, access to lump sum, RSA consolidation before payment of benefit.

Documentation process

While the old regulation outlined the documents required for retirees to access benefits, the revised regulation as a way of simplifying the process has now mandated PFAs to make efforts to ensure that all documentation preparatory to the retirement of the Retirement Savings Account (RSA) holder should be provided and concluded within a period of four months prior to the date of retirement.

"In order to ensure that prospective retirees are duly educated on the modes of accessing their benefits, PFAs have also been mandated to advise prospective retirees to check their websites and be acquainted with the CPS Retirement Pack containing features of Programmed Withdrawal (PW) and Retiree Life Annuity (RLA) at least three months to date of retirement. The pack also contains other salient issues that would guide the retirees towards a smooth retirement process".

Non-confirmation of employment status by employers

Also, the revised regulation has simplified the provisions on the notification and documentation required for access to RSA due to temporary loss of job.

Temporary loss of job has been defined as a situation "where an employee voluntarily retires, disengages or is disengaged before attaining the age of 50 years and is unable to secure another employment after four months of the disengagement."

"The provision addresses situations where employers refuse to confirm the retirement or disengagement of their former employees. Prior to this revision, a letter of acceptance of resignation or disengagement issued by the employer is mandatory for a pension contributor seeking payment of 25 percent for temporary loss of job. However, the Revised Regulation provides that where the employer fails/refuses to accept the

resignation letter from the employee, the PFA shall write the employer confirming the employee's resignation and ensure that an acknowledgement copy is kept as proof of receipt.

Where the employer fails to respond to the PFA's inquiry within 30 days, the employer's refusal is taken as acceptance of the employee's resignation for the purpose of benefits payment".

Additional lump sum payment

Significantly, in terms of lump sum payment, the revised regulation has clarified that the retirees shall be allowed to access additional lump sum after the payment of initial lump sum provided that there are additional inflows of funds into the RSA from the employers.

However, the additional remittances shall first be applied to augment pension up to 50 percent of the retiree's final salary while the balance may be paid out as lump sum.

Where the retiree's pension is already up to 50 percent of final

salary, the retiree may choose to collect the entire additional remittances as lump sum.

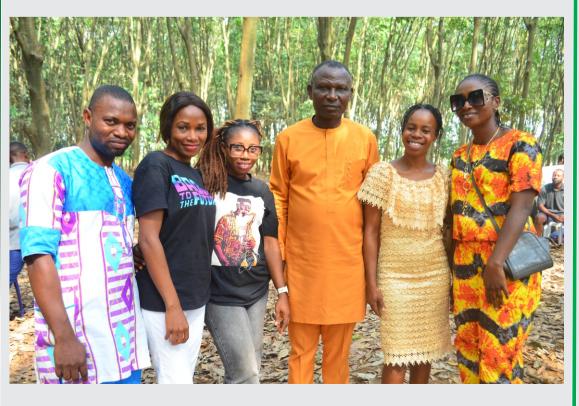
