The Rubber Research Institute of Nigeria, Gum Arabic Sub-Station Gashua, hosted a one-day training workshop on 'Agroforestry Techniques/Gum Arabic based Farming Systems for Gum Arabic Farmers in North Eastern Nigeria' at RRIN Gashua, Yobe State on 3rd April, 2025. The workshop was organized by the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, Abuja.

In attendance were Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, Dr. Marcus O. Arabic Producing States of Nigeria. The workshop brought together a total of 61 participants.

In the keynote address by the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, he emphasized that the gum arabic agroforestry-based farming system training was intended to diversify farmers revenue from their gum arabic plantation by planting compatible arable crops within the tree avenues before the maturity of the trees. This practice will help farmers earn additional income, improve their livelihood as well as reduce the payback period of their investment

Also, the Director, Federal Department of Agriculture encouraged the farmers to take full advantage of the training as the knowledge gained will help them put their limited land resources to optimum use and hence increased income.

The Executive Director, Rubber Research Institute of Nigeria, welcomed the participants at the workshop and emphasized that the principles and practices of agroforestry/gum arabic based farming system is to optimize land use, income generation, nutritional health and improvement of livelihood of gum arabic farmers in the North Eastern Nigeria.

The position paper promoting agroforestry techniques/gum arabic based farming systems for gum arabic farmers in North Eastern Nigeria was presented by Dr. Fakuta, N. M on behalf of RRIN while Dr. Abubakar Mohammed translated the paper in local 'Hausa' dialect.

The participants remarked that the workshop has enhanced their capacity on agroforestry practices/gum arabic based farming system. They promised to put the knowledge to use in their farms in other to enhance income and improve livelihoods from their gum arabic farming enterprises. They thanked the Federal Government and the Institute for the opportunity given to their association members to learn more about gum arabic agroforestry farming systems.

RRIN Monthly Seminar Series (MSS) for the year 2025

The fourth MSS for the year 2025 took place on Wednesday 23rd April, 2025 featuring two presentations. The first presentation by Mrs. R.L. Momoh, her Ph.D. pre-data project titled 'Sustainable Valorisation of Rubber Effluent for Biofertilizer and Potential Biogas Production: A Circular Economy Approach to Agricultural and Energy Sustainability'. In her discuss, she proposed that given its rich composition of organic matter, nutrients and microbial life, treated and untreated rubber effluent may offer environmentally friendly alternatives to chemical fertilizers, while enhancing soil health and may also be used in the manufacture of biogas. According to the presenter, the overall goal is to develop an integrated, sustainable framework for converting rubber effluent into valuable agricultural and energy resource.

The event, held at the RRIN Conference Hall, featured a series of enlightening lectures and practical demonstrations focused on **fire safety**, **basic first aid**, and **cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)**.

In her welcome address, the Director/CEO, RRIN, Dr. L.N. Dongo, represented by the Director/Head of Research Support Services, Dr. F.A. Akpobome, emphasized the importance of cultivating a safety-conscious workplace culture. She urged staff to take action beyond awareness, to strengthen safety policies and renew their commitment to health and safety standards. Declaring the event open, she encouraged continued collaboration between RRIN and WSO for a safer and healthier future.

Highlights of the day included lectures and practical sessions on:

- **Fire Safety** presented by Mr. Kelly Ogiesoba, covering fire types, causes, and the appropriate extinguishers for each class, and the PASS technique.
- Basic First Aid delivered by Mr. Ufuoma Sorogheye, focusing on fainting, heart attack, and bleeding care.
- **CPR** by Dr. Olalokun, outlining when and how to administer CPR in emergencies.

Following the lectures, participants engaged in an interactive question and answer session, and hands-on group demonstrations.

Health Corner Lobar Pneumonia

Pneumonia is an acute inflammation of the lung parenchyma caused by an infecting organism. When it involves a lobe of the lung, it is known as Lobar Pneumonia. The most common cause of Lobar Pneumonia in the adult is the *Pneumoccocus* (70–80%), others are *Klebsiella*, *Haemophilus influenzae* and *Staphylococcus* which are also associated with bronchopneumonia.

Clinical Presentations

- (1) Acute fever
- (2) Pain on affected side of the chest
- (3) Difficulty in breathing
- (4) Reduced movement of affected side of the chest.

Laboratory Investigation

- (1) Chest X Ray
- (2) E.S.R
- (3) Sputum Gram stain.

Treatment

- (1)Admit patient
- (2)Rehydration
- (3)Antibiotics
- (4)Analgesic/Antipyretic
- (5)Give Oxygen

Know your PSR

ABSENCE FROM DUTY ON ACCOUNT OF ILLNESS MEDICAL CERTIFICATE

070301 - If an officer is ill and unable to report for duty, he/she shall notify his/her Ministry/Agency in writing or by any other means of communication. Any prolonged absence from duty on ground of illness should be supported with any of the following documents:

- (a) Excuse Duty Certificate;
- (b) Light Duty Certificate;
- (c) Medical Certificate of treatment duly authorized by the Health care provider

An officer who is receiving medical treatment within his/her duty post shall report to his/her employer, his/her absence within 24 hours. An officer who is receiving medical treatment outside his/her duty post shall report to his/her employer, his/her absence within 48 hours.

070302 - When an officer presents himself/herself to duly authorized Healthcare Provider for medical examination, the latter shall examine and treat him/her and if necessary, give him/her either of the certificates listed in Rule 070301 and if he/she is admitted as an in-patient, the Healthcare Provider shall inform his/her Ministry/Extra-Ministerial Office.

070303 -When a Ministry/Extra-Ministerial Office reports to a Healthcare Provider that an officer of the Ministry/Extra-Ministerial Office is so ill that he/she is physically unable to present himself/herself for medical examination, the Healthcare Provider shall, as appropriate, either arrange for the officer to be brought to hospital for examination and treatment or visit the officer to examine and treat him/her. If the examination results in the officer being admitted to a Hospital as an inpatient, the Healthcare Provider will so inform the officer's Ministry/Extra Ministerial Office, otherwise he/she shall give the officer whichever of the Certificates listed in Rule 070301 as appropriate.

o70304 - When an officer forwards to a Healthcare Provider a report on his/her sickness by the private practitioner attending to him/her, the Healthcare Provider will, after due consultation with the private practitioner, issue whichever of the certificates listed in Rule as appropriate. The period of excuse or light duty entered on the first certificate issued shall not exceed three days unless the Healthcare Provider has examined the patient, in which case the period may be for up to seven days. Each period of extension, thereto, shall not exceed seven days and not more than a total of forty-two calendar days sick leave may be allowed on such extension. If the officer is still not fit for duty after forty-three calendar days sick leave, he/she shall be examined by a Medical Board. This shall also apply to an officer admitted to a Specialist Hospital on the recommendation of a Healthcare Provider.

.070305 - On any of the occasions listed in this Rule, the Healthcare Provider shall report the circumstances to the officer's Ministry/ExtraMinisterial Office:

- (a) When an officer is admitted to and when he is discharged from a Hospital.
- (b) When an officer refuses to carry out or in the opinion of the HealthCare Provider is neglecting to carry out, the medical advice he has been given.
- (c) When in the opinion of the Healthcare Provider an officer is feigning illhealth.
- **070306** If for any valid reason it is decided that an officer should be examined by a Medical Board, he must present himself for examination; the place and time instructed, and must afterwards comply with recommendation of the Board which will supersede any medical advice already given to him/her by a Healthcare Provider. An officer who fails comply with this rule shall render himself/herself liable to be treated a s h a v i n g b e e n a b s e n t w i t h o u t l e a v e .
